




Deploy Gray Rainbow Master Page

Activate Office SharePoint Server Publishing Infrastructure as follow

If you are using MOSS, go to Site Actions > Site Settings > under Site Collection Administration click on Site Collection Features > Activate Office SharePoint Server Publishing Infrastructure if it is not already activated.

Run Setup.exe

Extract the Gray Rainbow Master Page zip file on your SharePoint server. Run the Setup.exe application. Accept all prompts to complete the installation.

Activate the Feature

Go to Site Actions > Site Settings > under Site Collection Administration click on Site Collection Features > Activate the "Gray Rainbow Master Page" Feature.

Apply the new Master Page

The feature we just created placed the new master page in the master page gallery. However, it did not tell SharePoint to use this new master page on your SharePoint site.

- Go to, Site Actions > Site Settings > (Under Look and Feel Column) Master Page Link
- Apply "GrayRainbow.master" in both Site Master Page and System Master Page Category
- Check "Reset all subsites to inherit this Site/System Master Page Setting" check box
- In the Alternate CSS URL section click browse and select the GrayRainbow.css
- Click ok.
- Check on the Reset all subsites to inherit this alternate CSS URL
- Click OK.

- Inherit site master page from parent of this site
- Specify a master page to be used by this site and all sites that inherit from it.

Alternate CSS URL

Specify the URL of a cascading style sheet (CSS) to apply to this site. The CSS files should contain every class you might reference from any control and from any page in your site. This will help ensure that your site is displayed exactly as you want it to.

Click the first option to use the parent CSS URL of this site. Click the second option to use the Windows SharePoint Services default style. Click Browse to select different CSS style.

- Inherit Alternate CSS URL from parent of this site
- Use Windows SharePoint Services default styles
- Specify a CSS file to be used by this publishing site and all sites that inherit from it.

- Reset all subsites to inherit this alternate CSS URL

Instructions to Change the Site Name and Logo

- Go to Site Action > Site setting > Under Look and Feel > click on "Title, description and icon"
- Enter your site name in the "Title" text box
- Enter the URL for your logo as `/_LAYOUTS/GrayRainbowImages/logo.png`
- Click OK
